Model Diplomacy is a free classroom simulation of either the U.S. National Security Council (NSC) or the UN Security Council that takes place both online and in the classroom in a blended learning environment. It presents hypothetical situations based on real issues from past and present. It has three cases that involve Europe.

Model Diplomacy cases that involve Europe include:

- Economic Crisis in Europe
One of France's largest banks needs a bailout that its government likely cannot provide, a situation that is roiling global markets.
- NATO Enlargement in 1993
Set in December 1993: Following the collapse of the Soviet Union, many former Soviet states in Central and Eastern Europe have expressed interest in joining the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.
- Russia and NATO in the Baltics
The demands of ethnic Russian factory workers for political rights in Latvia have grown increasingly violent, and a Russian special operations unit has covertly entered Latvian territory.
